6. Annual report from Chair (Rachel Purcell)

Thanks to Bjorn for organizing the meeting. Thanks to Justin for all his help organizing the meeting. Thanks to the other members of the committee with their help in running the meeting. Membership of 210 - 60 more than last year. This came about because we proposed to move the meeting to Christchurch, which required membership to vote. Spent a lot of time considering the move to Christchurch, including discussing with the other societies. Electronic voting resulted in an overwhelming majority of voters voting in favour of moving to Christchurch, hence this was enacted. This is a trail basis, therefore we will need to discuss at next year's AGM, although because of bookings Christchurch is locked in for 2024, too. Tak Mak is coming next year as the plenary. We decided to hire an accounting firm to run the finances. They obtained tax refunds for us and they also bill the trades for us, so very effective use of money. Julian Eaton-Rye has resigned after many years of service. Thanks to Connor Watene-Sullivan for all his help around the mihi whakatau, and he will help next year, too. Finally, thanks to Jade for all her work - always doa fantastic job.

Delegates were around 600 without trade numbers. Looking to probably break even. Need to get more student numbers, as there were very few QMB posters this year.
